Autumn is notoriously a great season for fishing here in Perth and it is most definitely a favourite time for sports-fishermen with a huge array of species available.

Over the next few months those with boats and the right equipment can expect to tangle with Bonito on the 3-mile reefs and near the Gemini Wreck off Mindarie, Mahi Mahi at the FADS, Blue and Striped Marlin at the 'trench' west of Rottnest, Salmon both inshore and offshore, Spanish Mackerel outside the 3-mile reefs and off City Beach, Shark Mackerel around Rottnest, Yellowtail Kingfish around Rottnest and on the 3-mile reefs, Yellowfin Tuna south and west of Rottnest and off Mindarie, Samsonfish west of Rottnest and at the Gemini Wreck, and Wahoo NW of Rottnest near the FADS.

Depending on species, these fish are accessible to fishers with vessels ranging from 4 metres to 24 metres!

If the Salmon decide to grace us with their presence in reasonable numbers they can also be caught from beaches and on-shore reefs such as the North Mole, Leighton Beach, Cottesloe (Grant St reef), Swanbourne reefs, Floreat Drain, Trigg Blue Hole, reefs around North beach, and the Yanchep reefs.

Try for the Bonito from shore based locations such as the North Mole and northern boat harbour rock walls, and from boats you will see them harassing bait schools over the 3-mile reef system.

Other species commonly available are Whiting, Herring, Garfish, and Tailor to those fishing from shore based locations at the Marina's, in-shore reefs, and off the beaches.

Look for Squid over the weed beds off Hillarys, between the City Beach Groynes, and in Cockburn Sound.

Skippy are a popular target along the 3-mile reefs at this time of year and you may also find them at the North Mole at night. Some big "Storm Gardies" should be on the reefs as well.

The bottom fishing boaties shouldn't do too badly either with Dhufish and Breaksea Cod in quite close. Out deeper Baldchin Groper are caught in good numbers at this time of year and some big Dhufish are found in 50 to 60m of water north of Rottnest Is.

Even deeper in 200 to 300m you can catch various large Cod species, Ruby Snapper, Pink Snapper, Nanagai, and Sharks.

There are plenty of small sharks around so a boat trip to the in-shore reefs is worth-while or a night fish at any of the northern beaches could be productive. Mulloway are also cruising the metro beaches at night.

In the river, if you're after Bream, try the Garrett Rd Bridge, Caversham House, Ascot, Sth Perth Yacht Club, Bassendean, and Jo Jo's. There will be Tarwine (Silver Bream) at the Fremantle Bridges and Tailor along Karrakatta Bank.

There are also some massive crabs in the Swan, especially in the deep water at Blackwall Reach and Mosmans. The same deep water holds Mulloway and night time sessions here can be very rewarding.
